



Profession

- 'Profession' is a significant domain of human activity targeted towards participating in the larger order which includes the Society and nature around.
- One important domain happens to be in the form of production and production related activities. It also makes available the necessary physical facilities (livelihood) for oneself and one's family.
- Through professional Education (like Engineering), one acquires the specific skills and knowledge in order to make this contribution in the larger order.

Profession – in the Light of Comprehensive Human Goal

- Any Profession is a channel for participation by human beings in the larger order to achieve comprehensive Human Goal.
- In this process, one is able to contribute towards the livelihood of one's family and participate in the larger order (society and Nature).
- All these activities do require a certain degree of skill and are expected to be performed in consonance with the comprehensive Human Goal.
- The Profession is not only a means of earning one's livelihood but a means of one's evolution by participation in larger order.
- Thus, Profession is a 'Service'.

Competence in Professional Ethics

• 1. Clarity about the comprehensive human goal:

Samadhana-Samriddhi-Abhaya-Sah-astitva and its fulfilment through universal human order from family to world family.

- 2. <u>Confidence in oneself</u> as well as confidence in the Harmony, coexistence and self-regulation prevailing in entire existence based on the Right Understanding of oneself and the rest of existence.
- 3. <u>Competence of mutually fulfilling behaviour</u>, clarity and confidence in ethical human conduct and its correlation with sustainable personal as well as collective Happiness and Prosperity.

Competence in Professional Ethics

- 4. <u>Competence of mutually enriching interation</u> with Nature, ability to assess the needs for physical facilities for the family and their fulfilment through production systems ensuring harmony in the nature.
- 5. Competence of actualizing one's understanding in real life.

- Corruption in multiple forms at various levels
- · Tax evasion, misappropriation and misuse of public funds
- Misleading propaganda, unethical advertisements and sales promotion
- Cut-throat competition
- Exploiting the weakness of consumers through various enticements
- Adulteration and spurious production

Contradictions and Dilemmas

- In today's society, the present ethos guiding all our activities is primarily profit-maximization; wealth maximization, comfort maximization and all the systems and efforts are influenced by it.
- Examples
- Monsoon failure....Profit-maximization by business man selling at higher prices instead of lower prices.
- Pan Masala, Smoking....Glamorized advertisements showing one side......other side printing Warning: Injurious to Health.
- Medical Profession....Profit maximization during epidemic breakout instead of doing service to people.

- For each Profession the motivations of profit maximization eventually lead to unethical practices.
- With all these unethical process a continuous contradiction persists in the mind of such people as these unethical practices are not naturally acceptable to anyone.
- They create tension and anxiety at the personal level and one is tempted to adopt <u>dual personality</u> in terms of <u>trying to appear to be</u> <u>ethical and in reality act indifferently</u>.
